

Historical Kitchen Restoration Project



The Friends of Greystone are very excited to be working on renovating the Kitchen at Greystone Mansion.

#1 The faucets in the flower room, kitchen and butler's pantry shall be re-plated. The cabinet hardware shall be replaced in the style of the original pulls, it is a fluted Drum shape knob 1920-40's style (there are numerous knobs missing and mixed designs presently).





#2 Due to **Wolfgang Puck Catering's** generosity with sponsoring our October 6, 2012 event, the Friends of Greystone will be restoring the Historical Kitchen Marble Island. Missing and broken tiles shall be replaced to match the original. This work is being done by Jacqueline Moore Designs whose specialty is Historic Preservation. The Island, which is not original to the house, will be raised in height to 36 1/2 inches, refurbished inside and out by Jacqueline Moore Designs. Through the wonderful efforts of Suzanne Furst, a marble top will be donated by Walker Zanger and we will install it on the

#3 The very large and unique stove, a Magic Chef 1928, is presently at Antique Stoves where it shall be restored in the capable hands of Jimmy Rodriquez. The stainless steel, porcelain and burners shall be restored, missing dials and other parts will be replaced and it shall be thoroughly cleaned.

#4 The 1928 Westinghouse Icebox is being restored as well at Antique Stoves. Porcelain shall be redone, hinges re-plated, missing parts replaced and thoroughly cleaned.



Greystone 85th Anniversary



"Building The Dream"

Eighty-five years ago, the younger Doheny's completed construction of Greystone Mansion.

They took occupancy in October 1928, although Greystone's history goes back to June 8, 1914, when Edward Laurence Doheny Sr. purchased the 12.58 acre parcel of land from the Rodeo Land & Water for \$28,763. 28.

This 12.58 acres of land was conveyed to his son Edward "Ned" Laurence Doheny Jr. and his wife Lucy in 1926, with an additional 3 acres added years later. Construction of the mansion began around February 15, 1927 with the first construction photo No. 1 taken 4-9-27, and was completed 18 months later on September 28, 1928 with the last construction photo No. 16 taken 9-12-28 as the last two photos are missing from our collection.

It was Lucy Marceline Smith Doheny who envisioned what she wanted for the family and renowned architect Gordon B. Kaufmann who created the 46,054 square foot Greystone Mansion for them. Money was no object. The house alone cost \$1,238,378.76. It was the largest, most opulent house in the Los Angeles area.

Greystone was the official residence of the younger Doheny Family and in the family's ownership for twenty seven years. After two changes of ownership, Greystone Estate became the crown jewel of the City of Beverly Hills in 1965. Today it is the City's most visited historic attraction and has been on the Department of Interior's National Register of historic places since 1976.

As we celebrate Greystone's 85th anniversary, let's take the opportunity to revisit the building of a dream.

These photographs will go on permanent display in the Mansion's Grand Hallway for generations to appreciate.

Our Past, a Present to the Future?

On May 23, 2013 the Friends of Greystone hosted a spectacular event with the World Monuments Fund and Dr. Jonathan Foyle, Chief Executive, World Monuments Fund Britain

Dr. Jonathan Foyle took us on an illustrated presentation around the globe that highlighted his insightful view on the historic and cultural significance that our past gives us to better know who we are today and what makes our community important. Dr. Foyle's presentation was an inspiring look at the many challenges facing important works of architecture in the United Kingdom and around the world, and the multi-faceted benefits of ensuring their survival. "Greystone is a fascinating house, of great importance to the early twentieth-century heritage of Los Angeles and a beautiful asset to the city," Dr Foyle noted. "Much of its character recalls European buildings stretching back several hundred years, but its details reveal modern technology and the age of prohibition. This multi-layered interest, and the problems of taking custody of complex major buildings in an age of efficiency are typical of sites that come to us via the World Monuments Watch."



Jonathan Foyle trained as an architect and art historian, and holds a doctorate in

Archaeology, specializing in early Renaissance architecture in Britain. He developed a practical knowledge of major and minor historical monuments, first as an assistant surveyor of Canterbury Cathedral, and then as Buildings Curator at Hampton Court Palace and Kew Palace, and has taught and lectured widely. He is perhaps best known for presenting BBC broadcasts on architectural topics, but writes regularly for The Financial Times and is author of Architecture of Canterbury Cathedral (Scala, 2013). Jonathan joined World Monuments Fund in 2007, and lives in London.



A great many films are shot at Greystone every year. Most use bits and pieces of the mansion to stand in for something else. Like the recent Star Wars: *Into the Darkness* for example. In that film, Greystone was dressed up to look like the futuristic Royal London Hospital. In one scene, a hovercar even floats up the driveway past the almost unrecognizable mansion that has a glass and steel medical tower jutting from its backyard. In *Spiderman 3*, the mansion is somehow lifted hundreds of feet into the air so it can double for a penthouse apartment in a New York City skyscraper. Jerry Lewis raced through Greystone's halls keeping track of mentally afflicted patients in *The Disorderly Orderly*.

But every once in a while the set designers don't have to work so hard because Greystone gets to play itself – or at least a close cousin. *Witches of Eastwick* is one such example. In

Witches, Greystone's interiors are featured in a huge mansion on a hill. A mansion that was acquired by a mysterious stranger from out of town played by Jack Nicholson. Now truth be told parts of several estates served as the one estate in this movie, but the key scenes belonged to rooms in Greystone. The extravagant bedroom where Nicholson first seduces Cher, the first of the three witches, is actually the living room. And later when Cher, Susan Sarandon and Michelle Pfeiffer all labor over a cooking pot to cast a spell on Nicholson just like the three witches from Macbeth who toil and trouble while their cauldron bubbles, they concoct their brew in Greystone's kitchen. And from there they put their plan of removing Nicholson, the foul interloper, from their lives.


The final battle between Nicholson and the three witches climaxes in Greystone's kitchen, but one thing is noticeably absent. That one thing is the large kitchen island. In nearly

every movie filmed in the kitchen, the island has been removed. Taking it out frees up some cinematic space, but it also keeps the fake marble top from being seen and exposed for what it is. A cheap copy.




Design House International (DHI), the City of Beverly Hills and the Friends of Greystone will be presenting the 2013 Designer Showcase this November 2nd – November 24th.


