Since the beginning of Friends of Greystone's inception, one of our main goals has always been to raise awareness of the restoration projects that have been much needed at the Doheny Greystone Estate. Many years passed before we were able to gather the attention from City of Beverly Hills officials regarding Greystone's restoration needs and the importance of the Doheny Greystone Estate, all while we continuously sought and successfully obtained financial support from many generous individuals and private companies.

A major turning point with obtaining both donors and City of Beverly Hills support for needed restoration projects began with the first American Society of Interior Designers (ASID) Showcase House that was held at the Doheny Greystone Estate in 2007. The Friends of Greystone's goal was to create a Donor Recognition Wall that honored major financial contributions to Doheny Greystone Estate by individuals or companies. Our vision was dedicated on September 30, 2018 by City of Beverly Hills Honorable Vice Mayor John Mirisch along with members of the Doheny family and many donors and supporters.

Our Donor Recognition Wall constitutes a major aesthetic feature of the iconic image of the famous Doheny Greystone Estate gates at 501 Doheny Road where for years guests and family used this entrance up the winding road to the mansion's front door. The Donor Recognition Wall is located on the north wall of the old Fire Station facing the garden staircase as you descend from Greystone's upper parking lot.



The Donor Recognition Wall was sponsored by the Friends of Greystone with an in-kind donation by Southern California Bronze Company.



We thank our Friends of Greystone Committee Chair Arline Pepp and her Co-Chairs Betsy Weisman and Suzanne Furst for their years of tireless work on this project that now can be viewed by all guests visiting the park.



The Friends of Greystone are very excited to be working on renovating the Kitchen at Greystone Mansion.



#1 The faucets in the flower room, kitchen and butler's pantry shall be re-plated. The cabinet hardware shall be replaced in the style of the original pulls, it is a fluted Drum shape knob 1920-40's style (there are numerous knobs missing and mixed designs presently).



#2 Due to Wolfgang Puck Catering's generosity with sponsoring our October 6, 2014 event the Friends of Greystone will be restoring the Historical Kitchen Marble Island. Missing and broken tiles shall be replaced to match the original. This work is being done by Jacqueline Moore Designs whose specialty is Historic Preservation. The Island, which is not original to the house, will be raised in height to 36 1/2 inches, refurbished inside and out by Jacqueline Moore Designs. Through the wonderful efforts of Suzanne Furst, a marble top will be donated by Walker Zanger and we will install it on the Island.



#3 The very large and unique stove, a Magic Chef 1928, is presently at Antique Stoves where it shall be restored in the capable hands of Jimmy Rodriquez. The stainless steel, porcelain and burners shall be restored, missing dials and other parts will be replaced and it shall be thoroughly cleaned.



#4 The 1928 Westinghouse Icebox is being restored as well at Antique Stoves. Porcelain shall be redone, hinges re-plated, missing parts replaced and thoroughly cleaned.

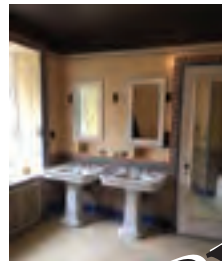

Description of the Tile Project

Silverlake Conservation was hired to repair and restore the tiles on both the floor and the walls in the upstairs Boys North Wing Bathroom. All tiles were cleaned and re-grouted, the unused metal hardware was removed and the cracks were repaired. Work was performed on approximately thirty of the square yellow tiles in the shower that were buckling from years of the Mansion's shifting, resulting in their separating from the wall. The tiles were being held temporarily in place with painter's tape. Silverlake Conservation delicately removed them, took the tiles to their studio where excess mortar was removed and broken tiles were repaired.

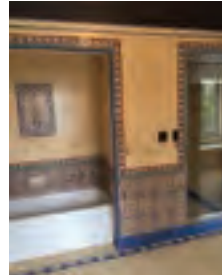
Tiles on the walls and floor are clean, holes between tiles are gone. All chrome has been polished.



Shower tiles have been repaired or replaced, holes in the tile above the towel rack have been repaired. All chrome has been polished.



Blue border wall tiles have been repaired or replaced, all tiles have been cleaned, all holes between tiles have been repaired and all chrome has been polished.



Tiles on the walls and floors are clean, holes between tiles are gone.

Description of Chrome Project

The original metal shower frame and towel rack were dirty and tarnished from years of neglect. The metal shower frame and metal towel rack hardware were cleaned and polished.

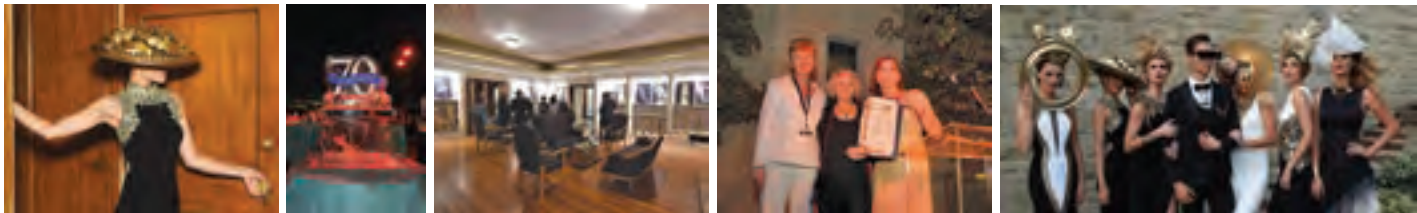

If you have a 46,000 square foot mansion with 55 livable rooms, how many doors do you have? That was the question for the Friends of Greystone when Baldwin Hardware headquartered in Orange County, offered to donate replacements for missing door knobs and other hardware throughout the Mansion in honor of their 70th Anniversary. Most of the original knobs had disappeared over the years Doheny Greystone Mansion was unoccupied. Some doors had no hardware, while others had mismatched replacements and needed replacement.

The answer is there are 164 doors at Greystone. Of these, Baldwin donated hardware and installation for 102 doors. The Friends of Greystone paid for additional repairs on 62 of the doors. The hardware chosen was close to the styles and finishes originally at Doheny Greystone Mansion as identified from historic photos and the few remaining originals in the house. All installation and repairs were completed by contractor Gerald Rose in record time. The results - all of Doheny Greystone Mansion's 164 doors are now looking beautiful and are in working order.

November 11th, Thursday BALDWIN HOSTS THEIR 70 YEARS BOLD GALA



Baldwin, as the culmination of a year's worth of anniversary activities across the country, gathered hundreds of influential architects and designers, customers and employees with a gala to celebrate their 70th Anniversary at the Doheny Greystone Mansion called, "Baldwin Door Couture". Each couture look incorporated design cues from Baldwin knobs from the past seven decades uniting legacy and history with beauty and innovation.

The Friends of Greystone and the City of Beverly Hills are extremely grateful and appreciative of Baldwin Hardware's donation which restored and recreated the Mansion's historic door knobs, locks, and miscellaneous hardware. The Friends of Greystone Board of Directors hired Fine Art Conservation Laboratories (FACL) to repair and restore the original oil painting that has hung since the 1940s above the fireplace in the Living Room of Doheny Greystone Mansion.

FACL's appraisal of the painting revealed that it appears to be of Italian origin. This genre of painting was produced as early as 1675 and as late as 1825 and served general decorative purposes. Originally it may have been part of a series of 6 or 8 similar paintings (subject, color and size) with a stucco trim around each painting, a type of paneling, that lined a room. This oil painting consist of at least three sections of canvas sewn together, denoting the lack of money available for the production. In fact, the quality of this painting is typical of a workshop production method: the figures and animals are of respectable quality; the architecture may have been done by another hand and the background, trees and sky may have been done by someone else. The original canvas quality, which can be seen along the top edge of the exposed painting, is typical of Italian open weave fabrics of the Baroque period. The painting's previous restorations include a lining that was done with a typical Italian technique of paste. The original canvas, the painting's original technique (underneath all the repainted layers), the style of painting and even the way the painting has aged (not referring to damage) are all typical of an aristocrat Italian country home painting, possibly Veneto during 1775 - 1800.

FACL'S work on this historic painting accomplished the Friends of Greystone's restoration goals. The unstable areas of flaking paint along the center crack of the canvas are now stabilized but all cracks will remain. The yellowed overall appearance of the painting remains but the composition appears clearer with better contrast and depth of field. The blotchy areas on the canvas that were previously retouched, especially in the sky, now blend in or are camouflaged much better although still somewhat visible from certain viewing points in the Living Room. The entire composition of the oil painting now flows much better as a result of the restoration work and the varnish that has been added gives added protection to the painting.

This oil painting in the Mansion's Living Room is one of the only original accessories to remain intact in the home. It is exciting to have completed this important restoration project.

PATRICK AND TIMOTHY'S SHARED BATHROOM

DESCRIPTION: Sons shared bath has a sea life motif. From the historical pictures of 1928 and 1945 it has not changed much. In 1945 the 1928 large European sink on wide legs stood high enough for the youngest child to use, but in 1945 it was removed and a chrome framed shower was installed. In 1928 the wall had a hand painted sea life mural and during a design show house the interior designer of the bathroom had an artist to paint the mural as similar as possible to the historic one. In 1945 wallpaper replaced the sea life mural.

Materials: Tile

Approximate Cost to Restore: \$18,000

CURRENT STATE OF BATHROOM:

The tile installation appears to be in good structural condition. There are several hairline cracks in the wall and floor tiles. The tiles are in good visual condition, other than the cracks and chips along the edges of the tiles.

The vanity sink wood cabinet and the full standing medicine cabinet (on the opposite side from the vanity sink not shown) have been painted a dark grey by an interior designer from a show house.

The cabinet hardware was changed by a show house interior designer to starfish.

The chrome needs polishing.

The tub and sinks need cleaning.

RESTORATION PROCESS INCLUDES:

The surface of the tiles and grout will be cleaned with a conservation grade detergent and distilled water.

Stubborn soiling and accretions will be reduced with solvent based cleaners and poultices.

The cracks and losses in the tiles will be filled with a reversible, inert, patching mortar or epoxy putty and painted with a system that mimics the surrounding surfaces in color and sheen.

Missing grout will be replaced with a proprietary grout similar in color and texture.

The grout will be sealed with a proprietary grout sealer.

The vanity sink wood cabinet and the full standing medicine cabinet (on the opposite side from the vanity sink not shown) has been painted by a designer from a showcase and needs to be stripped and repainted to match the historical picture from 1945.

The cabinet hardware changed by a show house interior designer needs to be removed and replaced with as close as possible the original from the historical picture of 1945.

The chrome needs polishing.

The tub and sinks need cleaning.

Paint ceiling and walls.

A report documenting the methods and materials used in this treatment will be prepared along with including maintenance recommendations.

HISTORIC GARDEN PERGOLAS

DESCRIPTION: Restoration of one or both historic pergolas that stood on the Mansion's Terrace in 1945 overlooking Beverly Hills and Los Angeles. Once restored they will be relocated behind the gatehouse at the lower east garden, also known as the Rose Garden.

Manufacturer: Unknown

DATE OF ORIGIN: Circa 1940's

Dimensions: n/a

Materials: Copper, Steel and Iron

Approximate Cost to Restore: \$41,300.00 for one pergola

CURRENT STATUS OF PERGOLAS:

The two pergolas were dismantled many years ago and some of the disassembled parts and remnants are currently being stored in the estate's garage waiting to be repaired, restored, and reassembled.

RESTORATION PROCESS INCLUDES:

Disassemble the copper paneled roof assembly with gutters and skirt

Weld and repair existing steel frame and decorative pieces

Cut existing steel legs and repair as needed (weld new extensions)

Add eight pieces of decorative iron at base of vertical steel legs

Manufacture and install a new copper gutter at roof perimeter

Remove old paint on undersides of roof panels. Prime and apply a fresh coat of white paint to underside of roof canopy

Repair existing copper panels

Replace existing standing seam caps with new

Transport reconditioned pieces to site and reassemble on site

New foundation will need to be poured prior to installation

Erect and assemble pergola (s)

Electrical stub out is to be provided to connect existing light at underside of pergola

LADIES POWDER ROOM BATHROOM



DESCRIPTION: The Ladies Powder Room was the first stop for many women upon arrival at Greystone Mansion, allowing them to freshen up before continuing inside the Mansion. In 1945 this room contained an antique 17th century Venetian baroque console of carved wood and gesso, gilded. Pierced shell carving on the apron with winged Putti heads at the corners fitted with a beige marble top with deeper beige and violet veining. The console held an oval gold wash bowl and specially designed and chased gold beaded fixtures. The most unusual piece of furniture was the Louis XV commode chair that hid the bowl.

Approximate Cost to Restore: \$6,000.00

CURRENT STATE OF LADIES POWDER ROOM BATHROOM

The only historical elements in this room are the stone walls, floor, and mirrors.

The majority of stone walls and floor are in very good condition but do show some signs of wear and age.

There is no original door in this room except the two windows.

The current sink was donated from a design show house and does not reflect the period.

The metal fixtures need polishing.

RESTORATION PROCESS INCLUDES:

Silverlake Conservation cleaned and repaired the metal masonry surfaces in 2017. The work included reducing staining and soiling in the stone floor and on the walls, removing non-historic hardware and cleaning the metal elements.

A report documenting the methods and materials used in this treatment has been written.

Maintenance recommendations were included by Silverlake Conservation in their final report.

The ceiling was painted in 2017 back to its original color for the period.

The baroque wood console/vanity, with gold leafing finish, was duplicated by a 1945 photo from the Friends of Greystone collection donated by the Doheny family. Interior designers and Friends of Greystone Board members, Suzanne Furst and Arline Pepp, also designed a coordinating display cabinet with beveled glass doors to hold donated Doheny family treasures, an old world distressed cabinet with carvings to house paper goods, other necessary supplies and a trash container to be installed in 2018.

Walker Zanger donated a beige marble slab for fabrication and installation for the baroque wood console. A biscuit porcelain sink, antique brass faucet and hardware, along with a beaded Venetian style cut and beaded crystal over gift metal frame ceiling light fixture, will complete the décor. An oil painting of the period will be donated by

Founders Gallery and hung on the north wall, to be installed in 2018 along with a period fabric window treatment over the window.

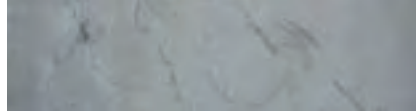

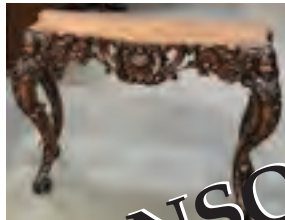

Interior designers and Friends of Greystone board members, Suzanne Furst and Arline Pepp, have recreated from photographs the exact look of the 1945 Ladies Powder Room Bathroom

- * Wood display cabinet with beveled glass doors and Queen Ann legs stained that includes gold leafing, glass shelves, used in the Mansion by the family to hold donated Doheny family artifacts
- * Wood supply cabinet with carvings that is old world distressed, inspired and stained to house paper goods and other necessary supplies
- * Wood trash container with lift off top, carvings and that is old world distressed, inspired and stained
- * Wood hand carved Baroque console/vanity with beige marble top to contain the sink. Walker Zanger donated the beige marble slab to be fabricated for the sink tabletop
- * Biscuit porcelain sink
- * Antique brass faucet and hardware
- * Light fixture of beaded Venetian style cut and beaded crystal over gift metal frame to hang from the ceiling
- * A framed oil painting of the period will be donated by Founders Gallery and will be hung on the north wall
- * A fabric window treatment over the one window will be coordinated with the 1945 picture pattern of flowering rose vines
- * Completion of the décor and subsequent installation will be done by mid 2018

KITCHEN FLOWER CUTTING AND BAKING PORCELAIN SINK

DESCRIPTION: One of three built-in kitchens, the Flower Cutting, Baking Kitchen is original. The porcelain sink is unique as it was made to hold flowers in the round center section of the sink.

Manufacturer: Unknown
Date of Origin: 1928
Dimensions: N/A
Materials: Porcelain
Approximate Cost to Restore: \$5,000.00

CURRENT STATE OF THE FLOWER CUTTING AND BAKING KITCHEN:

The sink is in poor condition; extensive leakage and stains

RESTORATION PROCESS INCLUDES:

Use poultice to remove as much stain as possible.

Remove soil, stabilize the fixture, and not using the fixture is the conservation approach for retaining the sink for presentation and interpretation for the indefinite future. A reversible treatment that aesthetically reintegrates an area of loss or provides a pleasing "like new" appearance is not a bad approach. However, it is not necessary to restore a material or finish to original, "like new" appearance.

A report documenting the methods and materials used in this treatment will be prepared along with including maintenance recommendations.

MR. DOHENY'S HISTORIC BATHROOM

DESCRIPTION:

Mr. Doheny's Master Bedroom Bath has stone floors and stone tiles on the lower half of the walls. The sink is constructed from matching stone.

Manufacturer: Unsigned

DATE OF ORIGIN: 1928

Dimensions: N/A

Materials: Tile and Stone

Approximate Cost to Restore: \$6,100.00



CURRENT STATE OF MR. DOHENY'S MASTER BEDROOM BATH

The majority of the stone are in very good condition but do show some signs of wear and age. There are tile chips and losses, particularly around floor and wall cracks. There are also losses in the tile and hardware for fixtures that are no longer used. Some of the hardware is still embedded in the tile and stone and should be removed. The stone sink in one of the master bathrooms is cracked and displaced and one of the shower walls has tile that has been pushed out due to displacement behind the interior shower wall.

RESTORATION PROCESS INCLUDES:

A representative area will be chosen to provide a mock-up for the client to review before proceeding with the entire installation.

The surface of the stone sink, stone tiles and grout will be cleaned with a conservation grade detergent and distilled water.

Stubborn soiling and accretions will be reduced with solvent based cleaners.

The cracks and accompanying losses will be filled with a reversible, inert, patching mortar or epoxy putty and painted with a system that mimics the surrounding surfaces in color and sheen.

Missing grout will be replaced with a proprietary grout similar in color and texture.

The grout will be sealed with a proprietary grout sealer.

A report documenting the methods and materials used in this treatment will be written. Maintenance recommendations will be included with this report.

LIBRARY MUSEUM

DESCRIPTION: Transform Library into a permanent museum of Doheny artifacts, currently in storage, that have been generously gifted to the Friends of Greystone by family descendants. Most of this exquisite collection were once used at Greystone Mansion.

Manufacturer: McCoy Construction, selected contractor for transforming existing Library into a permanent museum.

DATE: Restore Library, along with installing museum quality cabinets, to the original 1928 photos with barrel ceiling and wood paneling

Dimensions: Entire Room

Materials: Rift White Oak Wood

Approximate Cost to Restore: \$452,000

CURRENT STATE OF LIBRARY:

The room was totally stripped by Mr. Doheny when she moved from Greystone in 1955. There is nothing original existing in the room, with the exception of the doors.

RESTORATION WORKS INCLUDES:

Using the existing framework of the Library

Glass - Cabinet shelves, cabinet doors with locks

Electrical - Cabinetry fixtures and lighting controls

Ceiling Plaster - Barrel ceiling with plaster detailing similar to the 1928's ceiling photos

The Doheny Greystone Mansion was built in the 1920s and is listed as Landmark No. 4 by the City of Beverly Hills. Design and construction was the work of Mr. & Mrs. Edward Doheny, Jr. and the master architect Gordon Kaufmann. The house serves as a museum in the broad sense and continuously is used for special events by the City of Beverly Hills, the Friends of Greystone and the general public.

The priority project for 2020 will be the restoration of the Mansion's Library which will become a museum to display the many treasures the Friends of Greystone have received from the Doheny family that were in the Mansion while they lived in Greystone from 1928 to 1955.

The restoration contract was awarded to KC Restoration Company and construction will begin January 2020.

The entire estate took over three years to complete at a total cost of \$3,166,578.12, the Mansion alone cost \$1,238,378.76.

Originally located on the grounds were stables, kennels, tennis courts, a fire station, gatehouse, swimming pool and pavilion, greenhouse, a lake, babbling brooks and cascading waterfalls.

13 East Alcove


The Mansion was designed by the renowned Southern California architect Gordon B. Kaufmann and was constructed by the P.J. Walker Company. Paul G. Thieme was the landscape architect.

On the night of February 16, 1929, five months after the family had moved in, Ned Doheny was found shot to death inside the home, 36 years old and the victim of an apparent murder-suicide perpetrated by his longtime personal friend and aid Hugh Plunket.

Lucy continued to live at Greystone until 1955, after which she and her second husband Leigh M. Battsan sold the majority of the original land to the Paul Trousdale Corporation, developers of the prestigious "Trousdale Estate" homes.

The following year Lucy and her husband sold for approximately \$1.5 million, the remaining 18.3 acre parcel, including Greystone Mansion, to Henry Crown of Chicago based Park Grey Corporation. Mr. Crown never occupied the property but instead leased it out as a popular filming location.

There are fifty-five livable rooms within the 46,054 square feet of living space in the Mansion. The family's bedrooms were spread throughout the second floor, in the north wing a circular staircase led to an adjacent recreation wing that contained a movie theater room, an original Brunswick bowling alley, a billiard room and a hidden bar.

On September 16, 1971, the entire 18.3 acre site, including Greystone Mansion, was formally dedicated as a public park by the City of Beverly Hills.

On April 23, 1976, Greystone Estate was officially recognized as a historic landmark and was entered into the Registry of Historic Places.

On January 25, 2013 the Doheny Greystone Estate was listed as Historic Landmark #4 on the City of Beverly Hills Local Register of Historic Properties.

On December 1, 2018, The El Camino Building LLC at 136 El Camino Drive in Beverly Hills, previously owned by the Doheny family, moved their offices and donated to the Friends of Greystone a very important artifact of an oil tanker model known as the "C. A. Canfield". The oil tanker model, in a glass showcase, measures 15" high by 105" wide by 8" deep. Our research confirmed that most of Doheny's oil tankers were named after his children or friends like Edward L. Doheny, E. L. Doheny III, William H. Doheny, Jr, R. G. Stewart, E. G. Seubert and Charles E. Harwood.

This historic oil tanker model represents the fleet of tankers owned by the Dohenys as they transported oil across the sea. The Doheny family legacy began with Edward L. Doheny, Sr.'s discovery of oil in a tar befouled lot in Los Angeles in 1892 where he drilled the region's first commercial free-flowing well and then he ventured into Mexico discovering oil. An oil tanker, also known as a petroleum tanker, is a ship designed for the bulk transport of oil or its products.

Oilman Edward L. Doheny, Sr., one of the leading industrial titans of the early twentieth century, played a singular role in the dawn of the age of petroleum. Doheny helped give birth to the modern world as we know it but was denied the place he deserved in popular memory as one of the true giants of his age. New generations can evaluate Doheny's contribution and assess his petroleum legacy. We are all Doheny heirs.

The Doheny Greystone Estate was constructed with money made from oil. The Doheny discovery of oil was the start of the Industrial Revolution, giving great significance to the preservation of Doheny Greystone Estate and the Doheny family legacy.

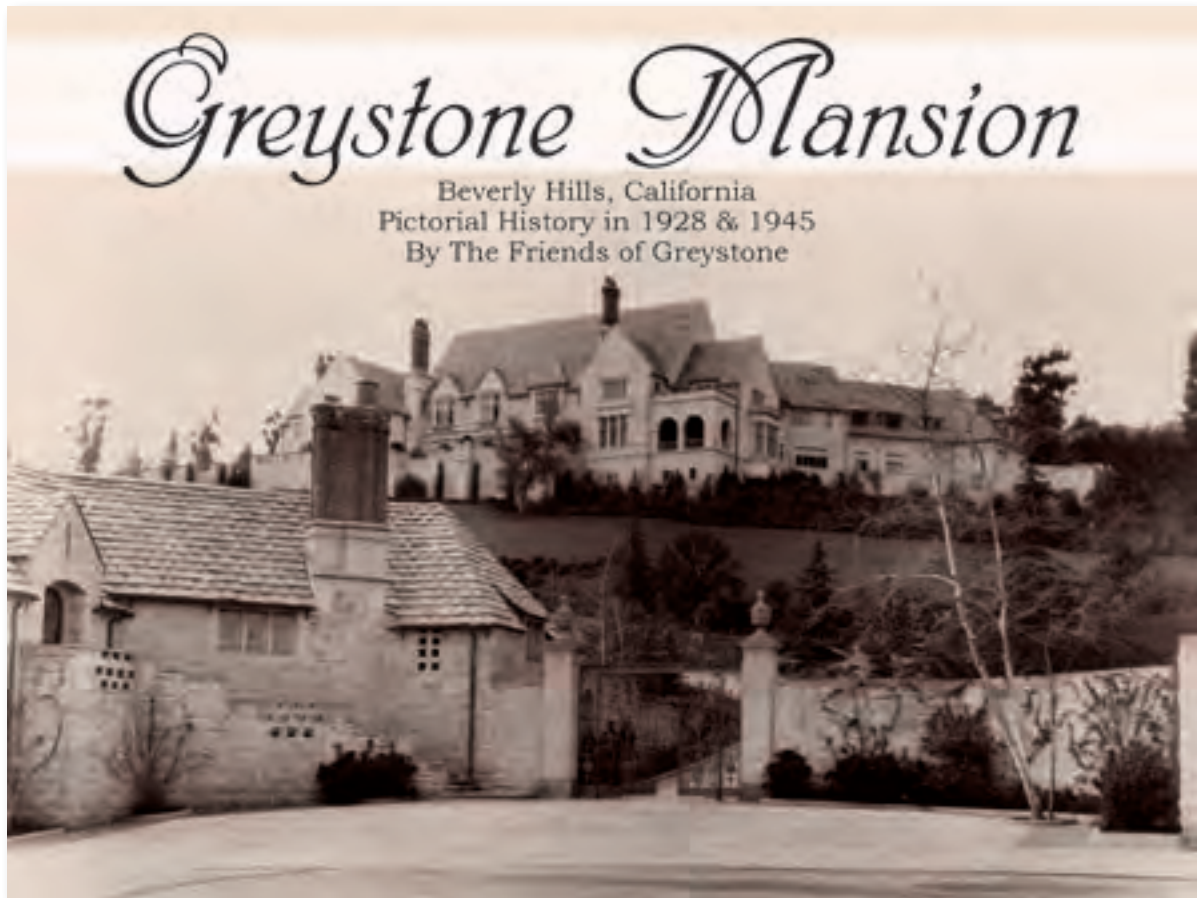
We have created an extensive poster board exhibit full of historical information that we display at our quarterly Best Kept Secret Tours and annual Members Open House.

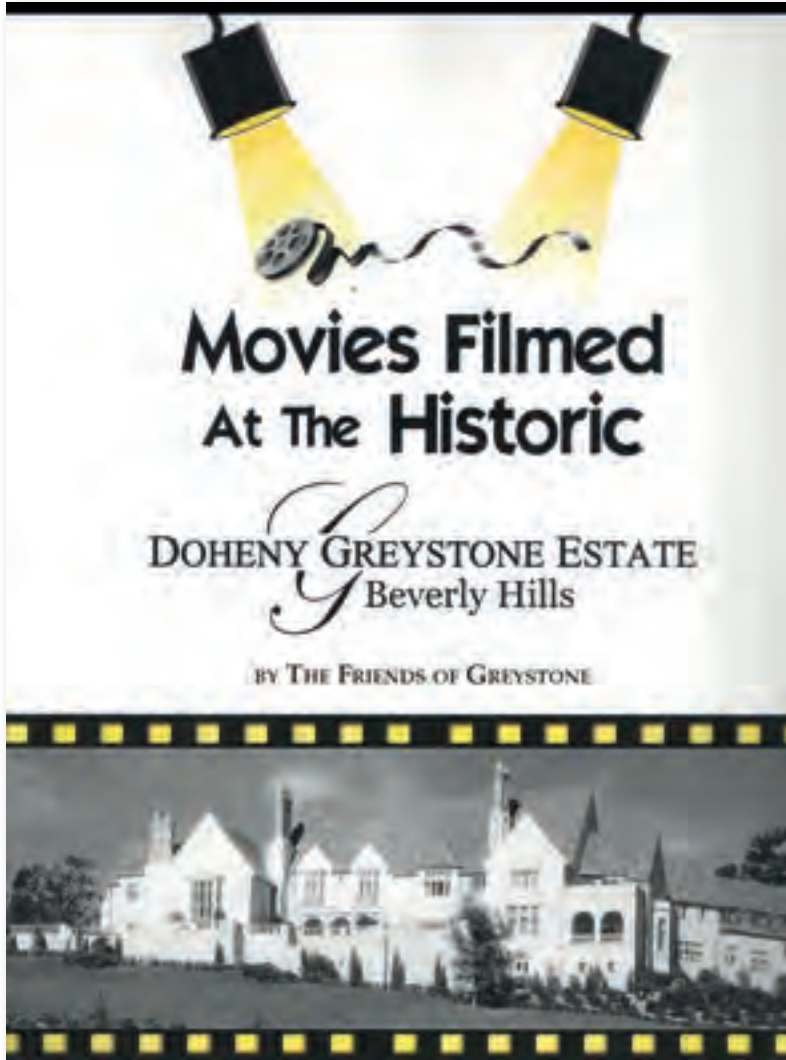

For Greystone's architect, Mrs. And Mrs. E. L. Doheny, Jr selected Gordon B. Kaufmann of Los Angeles, one of California's most sought after residential architects. Gordon Kaufmann had designed Greystone Mansion in an English Tudor style rather than the Spanish Colonial Revival which seemed to have typified 1920s Southern California.

The mansion was the last major part of the estate to be built. The digging of its foundation started on February 15, 1927. Greystone's exterior reflects 19th century English Revival architecture with two-story turrets faced with grey Indiana limestone, thick Welsh slate on the roof, five red brick chimneys, and leaded windows. The home included 55 rooms in 46,054 square feet of living space, with living rooms, bedrooms, kitchens, and an entertainment wing consisting of a theater, bowling alley, and billiard room. Greystone derived its name from the greyish tint of the limestone. Known as Ned, his wife Lucy, and their five children moved into the residence in September 1928. The entire estate is 18.3 acre and took three years to complete at a cost of over \$3 million, an almost unimaginable sum in real estate at the time. The original cost to construct Greystone's entire estate was \$3,166,578.12, the Mansion alone cost \$1,238,378.76.

The **gatehouse** is located on the lower grounds on the southeast corner of the Estate. It was built in the same style as the mansion (stone walls and slate roof). The 1,800 square feet structure with seven rooms is attached to the Doheny gate, which was once the main entrance to the estate.

By mid-1928, the estate was virtually finished, except for the mansion where work was progressing rapidly.

Reigning matriarch of Southern California's pioneering, petroleum wealthy Doheny family. The former Lucy Smith of Pasadena was married in 1914 to Edward Laurence Doheny Jr., only child of Edward L. Doheny, Sr. who struck oil in Southern California and Mexico. The couple had five children, Lucy Estelle Doheny Washington (b.1915), Edward Laurence Doheny (b.1917), William Henry Doheny (b.1919), Patrick Anson Doheny (b.1923) and Timothy Michael Doheny (b.1926). Ned Doheny and his wife built the legendary Doheny Greystone Estate next to the former Doheny Ranch in Beverly Hills.

The Doheny's lived in the Mansion less than a year before Ned was fatally shot by his secretary on February 16, 1929. The young widow served as administrator of Doheny's estate of about \$14 million in stock in the Petroleum Securities Corp. Three years later she married Leigh M. Battson, a San Francisco and Los Angeles financier. Mrs. Battson was a founding member and several term president of the Junior League of Los Angeles, and during World War II was a leader of Naval Aid. She was active in the Los Angeles and Eldorado Country Clubs. Fourteen grandchildren, twenty seven great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren also survived her.
