PICTORIAL CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS

**T**he Doheny Greystone Mansion was built in the 1920s and is listed as Historic Landmark No. 4 by the City of Beverly Hills. Design and construction was the work of Mr. & Mrs. Edward Doheny, Jr. and master architect Gordon Kaufmann. The house serves as a museum in the broad sense and is continuously used for special events by the City of Beverly Hills, the Friends of Greystone and the general public.

The priority project for 2020 was the restoration of the Mansion's Library which also serves as a museum to display the many treasures the Friends of Greystone were gifted from the Doheny family that were in the Mansion when they lived in Greystone from 1928 to 1955.

The restoration began mid 2020 with a scheduled completion date of December 2020, but due to the Coronavirus Pandemic and delays in acquiring construction materials, the completion date extended into early 2021.

The Sing for Hope Pianos are one of the world's largest annually recurring public arts projects, placing artist-designed pianos in parks and public spaces for anyone and everyone to play. Sparking impromptu music-making and connection, the Sing for Hope Pianos create joy and community, bringing people together. Through an integrated partnership with the City of Beverly Hills and the Wallis Annenberg Center for the Performing Arts, Sing for Hope placed 16 artist-designed pianos throughout Beverly Hills from August 5 - September 6, 2021, and then donated and transported them to public schools across the greater Los Angeles area.

# DOHENY GREYSTONE SWIMMING POOL AND PAVILION

The pool was divided into two sections, a large shallow area for swimming and a ten foot plus deep section for diving. There was a diving board on the right and a higher diving platform at the far end of the pool.

The swimming pavilion was a reinforced concrete structure adjoining the swimming pool of irregular shape. Total area was approximately 1,120 square feet, height one story. A wood frame pergola adjoined the south side. Men's and women's dressing rooms were located at both ends of the building.

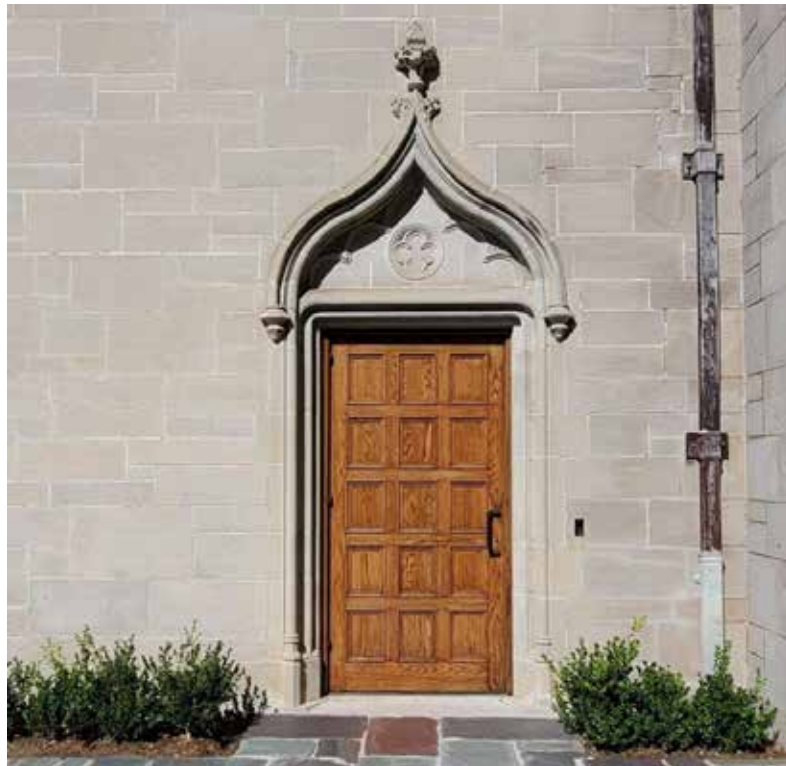

## DOHENY GREYSTONE MANSION'S LIVING ROOM DOOR LEADING TO THE TERRACE

# DOHENY GREYSTONE ESTATE'S GATEHOUSE



Greystone's seven room Gatehouse is located on the Estate's lower grounds at the northwest corner of Doheny Road and Loma Vista. It was built in 1926 in the same style as the mansion with stone walls and slate roof. The 1,800 square foot structure is attached to the Doheny gate, which was once the main entrance to the estate. This building was occupied by the superintendent of the grounds as his home. The Gatehouse is currently used by the City of Beverly Hills as offices for Greystone staff.

## UPPER PARKING LOT



Doheny Greystone Mansion and its grounds are close to their original condition with the exception of the following alterations. The City of Beverly Hills turned the vast landscaped upper area above the mansion into a twenty million gallon reservoir. Above the reservoir now is a two hundred car parking lot.



The parking lot was designed in keeping as much as possible with the beauty of the park. There are numerous planters on the large parking lot containing both trees and plants. The restroom and reservoir entrance were made of limestone and flagstone to match the mansion. Artistic banisters were constructed around the edge of the parking lot that are almost identical to the ones in the adjoining formal gardens. There is no need to worry about the impact of the reservoir because it is underground.

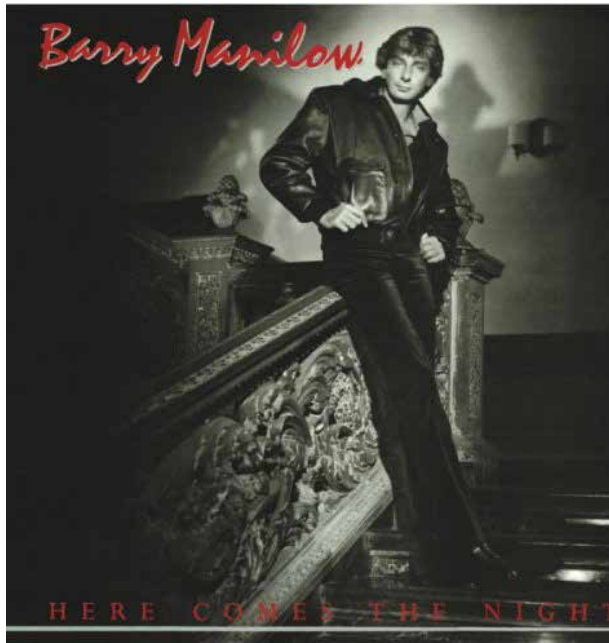

# DOHENY GREYSTONE MANSION'S THEATER RESTORATION PROJECT WON AN AWARD

As an integral and original structure of the historic Doheny Greystone Mansion, the 34-seat former motion picture theater underwent a face-lift to restore its distinctive interior design with 21st-century acoustics and audiovisual systems. Adapting existing wall and ceiling cavities for new theater equipment, electrical conduit and HVAC ducts required precision and creativity as concrete beams blocked the ceiling cavity every 6 feet. Lighting, speakers and other equipment are concealed above wood coffers, while portions of the ceiling can be lowered as needed for access to these otherwise hidden elements. The cinema screen also is retracted and concealed in the ceiling space when not in use. Blending the system's movable doors into the wooden ceiling surface required extensive remodeling, calculations and discussions between carpenters and door manufacturers. The team enabled access for disabled visitors with installing a wheelchair lift in the original garage by creating a portal with a curved door through the existing stair.

MATT Construction submitted the Greystone Theatre project for an ENR Construction Award, and the project received an Award of Merit in the Southern California/Hawaii region in the Renovation/Restoration category. One "Best Project" and one "Award of Merit" awards are given in each category. The award winners were recognized in the October issue of ENR (Engineering News-Record).
