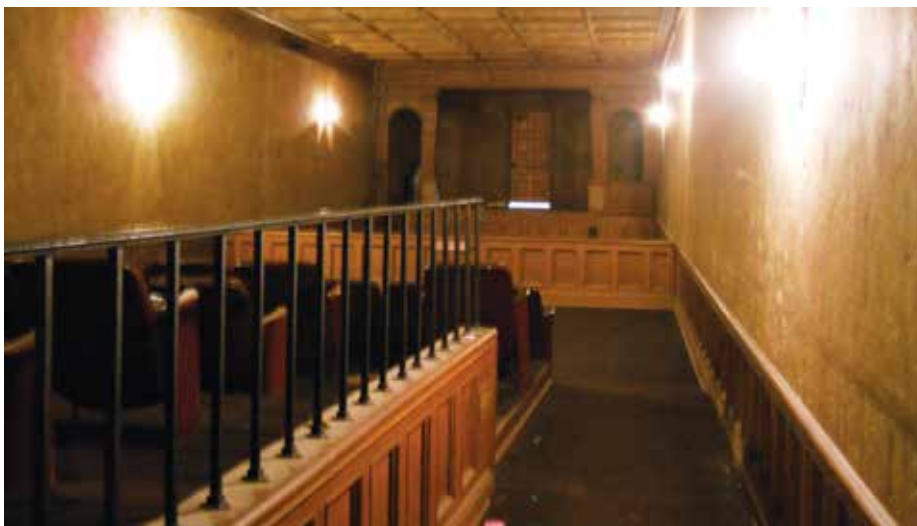

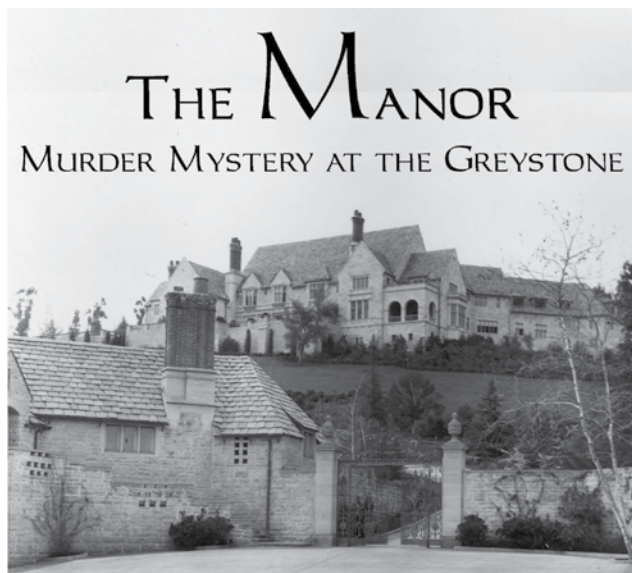
The Friends of Greystone, a nonprofit volunteer group dedicated to restoring and preserving the mansion, included restoring the theater among several projects requiring improvements. The City of Beverly Hills restoration to the theater was spearheaded by the current City of Beverly Hills Council Members lead by Mayor John Mirisch. Completion date is anticipated to be early 2020. The project required the removal and replacement of seats, preserving historic light fixtures and woodwork, while also installing new flooring, audio and video technology, security and telecommunication systems, roofing and waterproofing.

Built in 1927-1928, and designed by renown architect Gordon B. Kaufman, this magnificent mansion was once the home of Edward Laurence Doheny, Jr., his wife Lucy and their five children. Often referred to as the Hearst Castle of Southern California, the Doheny Greystone Estate is listed on the National Register of Historic Place and will forever be preserved.



Almost ninety years later the Grand Entry, more specifically the intricately hand carved wood staircase, still shares the magnificence and beauty of the gilded age of architecture.

Why This Designer Stands By Fake Flowers

Nina Campbell, one of London's most storied interior designers, on why faux florals shouldn't get a bad rap

Nina Campbell is one of London's most storied interior designers, with a career that dates back to a stint working for iconic British designer John Fowler when she was just 19—and a client list that includes the royal family and Ringo Starr. But to some, her untraditional love of faux flowers may come as a surprise.

"I suppose fake flowers do have a rather bad rap," she says. "People have always thought you should get fresh ones, especially in England, where we have wonderful gardens and parks. But fake can look quite good—and of course they last. I think of them like an art installation."

Indeed, artificial blooms have long amassed a kind of undercover following in the design industry, and were a favorite of the late decorator Mario Buatta. (He was once quoted in the Los Angeles Times as saying, "Some people still turn up their noses, but I think it's okay to use artificial and dried flowers and plants," adding that he drew the line at plastic varieties.) Here, fellow faux-floral devotee Campbell shares her definitive tips for shopping and using imposter flowers, and provides what may be the final answer on what, exactly, they should be called. "Faux flowers, false florals, new botanicals," she says. "I can't be dealing with all these newfangled words. I just call them fake."

Then think about how they work with the light. In my Greystone Mansion project, I had huge bowls of flowers sitting on the windowsill, and they looked beautiful with the light coming through them.

City of Beverly Hills and Friends of Greystone Restoration Project 2020 Doheny Greystone Mansion Library/Museum

The Doheny Greystone Mansion was built in the 1920s and is listed as Landmark No. 4 by the City of Beverly Hills. Design and construction was the work of Mr. & Mrs. Edward Doheny, Jr. and the master architect Gordon Kaufmann. The house serves as a museum in the broad sense and continuously is used for special events by the City of Beverly Hills, the Friends of Greystone and the general public.

The priority project for 2020 will be the restoration of the Mansion's Library which will become a museum to display the many treasures the Friends of Greystone have received from the Doheny family that were in the Mansion while they lived in Greystone from 1928 to 1955.

The restoration contract was awarded to KC Restoration Company and construction will begin January 2020.

DESCRIPTION: Transform Library into a permanent museum of Doheny artifacts, currently in storage, that have been generously gifted to the Friends of Greystone by family descendants. Most of this exquisite collection were once used at Greystone Mansion.

CURRENT STATE OF LIBRARY:

The room was totally stripped by Mrs. Doheny when she moved from Greystone in 1955. There is nothing original existing in the room with the exception of the doors.

RESTORATION PROCESS INCLUDES:

Using the existing framework of the Library

Glass - Cabinet shelves, cabinet doors with locks

Electrical - Cabinetry fixtures and lighting controls

Ceiling Plaster - Barreled ceiling with plaster detailing similar to the 1928's ceiling photos

Cabinetry and Millwork - Rift White Oak cabinetry, wall paneling, pilasters, trim, includes all hardware

Painting - Staining of all new and existing woodwork, painting of new ceiling and walls

Museum items include, but are not limited to, personal family letters and family pictures, linens including many tablecloths and napkins, oil paintings, first edition books, full sets of fine china tableware and glassware, men's and women's wallets, vanity hair grooming sets, luggage, custom made parade saddle, men's gold personal items, ladies gold mesh handbag, Chinese decorative accessories, sterling vases, chafing dishes.

VISITING

The grounds are open to the public for self-guided visits. The mansion is only open during special programs such as Music in the Mansion and Friends of Greystone events. Park ranger tours of the mansion and gardens are held the first Saturday of the month December through April. For more information or to register for these popular tours: 310.285.6835.

Public restrooms are located in the original firehouse near the mansion.

Due to the historic nature of the gardens, no picnicking or animals are allowed. Smoking is prohibited in all areas of the park (including the parking lot).

All photography, with the exception of souvenir photos with a small camera, requires a permit.

LOCATION & DIRECTIONS

The Greystone **entrance** is located at 905 Loma Vista Drive, Beverly Hills, CA 90210.

The Greystone **office**, inside the original gatehouse, is located at 501 Doheny Road, Beverly Hills, CA 90210. The office can be reached outside the park from Doheny Road. If you are walking in the park, the office is located at the bottom of the hill, adjacent to the rose garden.

To get to Greystone, take Sunset Boulevard to Foothill Road. Turn north on Foothill, which curves right and becomes Doheny Road. Turn left at Loma Vista Drive and then left into the driveway at 905 Loma Vista Drive. Park in the lot at the top of the steep hill. Parking is free.

Cypress Lane

Paul G. Thiene, landscape architect, designed all of the Estate's gardens. Cypress Lane was on the hillside behind the Mansion and was part of a series of Italian Renaissance-inspired "garden rooms". For these terraces, fountains and gardens, "no attempt" was made to use cheaper materials. The walkways were all Vermont slate. The stone for the walls was limestone shipped from Indiana. Sculptural stone details were all carved on the job.



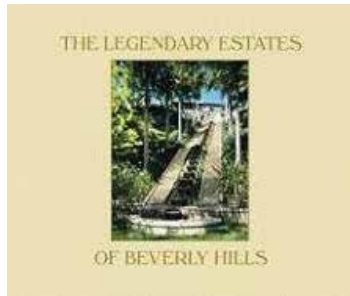
